Dear Conservation Easement Partner,

English ivy (Hedera helix spp & hibernica) chokes out surrounding plants, stresses supporting trees, accelerates wood rot, and destabilizes banks. Control or containment of several varieties of ivy are required in Washington State. If you have ivy growing on the ground or in the trees, we can assist with you removal and help you make plans for disposal and site restoration once the ivy is gone. Let us help you keep English ivy where it belongs...on the other side of the Atlantic.
